Washington joined the National Assembly of Sportsmen's Caucuses (NASC) in 2005. In 2016, Representative Pam Roach served as an alternate on the NASC Executive Board. Representative Roach was also the recipient of the 2013 NASC Heritage Award for her hard work and dedication to furthering the interest of Washington's sportsmen. Since founding caucus leaders have worked to protect sportsmen's rights in an increasingly difficult state. Occasionally partnering with neighboring Oregon Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus members to protect fishing on the Columbia River.

Policy Highlights

- Caucus co-chairs coordinated closely in 2024 to protect sportsmen and women from a high volume of anti-gun bills.
- In 2023 The Washington Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus helped to secure Governor Jay Inslee's signature on the National Hunting and Fishing Day Proclamation showing state support for sportsmen's heritage.
- The 2023 Bio-Diversity Funding Package brought diverse support around wildlife and habitat conservation in Washington State.
